We will guide you through the process of connecting to Truman's secured wireless network in Windows 11, Chromebooks, Android/Google phones and tablets, macOS, and iOS devices.

If you need assistance setting up your wireless connection, you may contact the IT Service Center at (660) 785-4544, or visit the IT Service Center at Pickler Memorial Library 203.

For any wireless devices that do not support WPA2-Enterprise (gaming consoles, SMART TV, streaming devices, etc.), you will need to Register the device and connect to "TrumanDevices." More information can be found at the "How to Connect" link mentioned above.

NOTE: The Truman username and password referred to in these instructions are the same credentials required to access campus computers and TruView.

Windows 11*

1. Locate your wireless icon in the bottom right-hand corner of the task bar, near the date and time.
2. Click on the arrow next to the Network Icon.
3. Locate and click on the wireless connection named “TrumanSecureWireless.”
4. Click on “Connect automatically” and then click “Connect.”
5. A window should pop up asking for your username and password. Type your Truman username and password then click submit. You should now be connected to “TrumanSecureWireless.”

Chromebook*

1. Click on wireless connection icon in the lower right hand corner of the desktop screen.
2. Choose the “TrumanSecureWireless” from the window that appears and input the following options:
 - For “EAP” method, select “PEAP” and for the Phase 2 Authentication select “MSCHAPv2”
 - For Server CA certification, select “Do Not Check” or “Do Not Validate”
 - For identity, enter your Truman username with truman\ Example: truman\username
 - For password, enter your Truman password
 - Check the save identity and password box and then click, “Connect;” do not press enter

NOTE: *If you had the connection setup previously and these steps did not work, please “Forget the Network,” restart the device, and then go through the steps above again.*

Google Pixel/Motorola*

The Pixel and some Motorola phones will not connect to “TrumanSecureWireless.” You will need to register your device’s Wi-Fi MAC address at: <https://its.truman.edu/docs/trumandevices-wireless-network/> and connect to “TrumanDevices” with the password the registration page issues.

NOTE: *When connecting the Pixel to “TrumanDevices,” click on “Advanced” and change the “Privacy” setting to use “Device MAC.” Your device will not connect if it is set to, “Randomized MAC.”*

Residential Hall 5GHz Network

All Truman Residence Hall rooms have a 5GHz wireless access point equipped with 3 Ethernet wired ports. Most devices have a Dual-Band (2.4 and 5GHz) wireless capability, but there are still some devices that only support a 2.4 GHz network i.e. some Chromebooks, streaming devices, older phones, etc. If your device does not support 5GHz network, it will not show Truman networks available on the device.

To assure your device will work in the Residence Halls, verify it supports dual-band and or states 5GHz. There are 5GHz network adapters that can be connected to devices like Smart TVs, Chromebooks, etc. that can be purchased and connected using USB, USB C; or for a Smart TV, you can get a 5GHz streaming device like Roku, Google Chromecast, etc.

**To access Truman resources like Registration, Microsoft 365, Email, and VPN, DUO Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) is required. Visit <https://its.truman.edu/DUO> for installation, usage details, and to confirm your device's operating system meets the supported version requirements.*

macOS 14-15-26*

1. Click on the Wi-Fi Status menu on the menu bar and then select “TrumanSecureWireless.”
2. Enter your Truman username and password and check “Remember this information” and then click “Ok.”
3. If a certificate window appears, click “Show Certificate” and then check the “Always trust these certificates” box. Click “Continue.”
4. If prompted to accept system changes, you will need to use your systems password, not your Truman account.
5. You may see a message asking you to save your password into your keychain; if so, click “Yes.”
6. You should now be connected to “TrumanSecureWireless.”

iOS devices 18-26*

1. Go to “Settings” then click “Wi-Fi.”
2. Select “TrumanSecureWireless” from the “Choose A Network” list.
3. Enter your Truman username and password then click “Join.”
4. When you are prompted, select “Trust” in the “Certificate” window. You should now be connected to “TrumanSecureWireless.”

Android devices 13-16*

1. Go to your “Applications” or “Programs” list and choose “Settings.”
2. In “Settings” click on “Connections.”
3. In “Connections” click on “Wi-Fi.”
4. In the list of available “Wi-Fi” Networks choose “TrumanSecureWireless.”
5. Use your Truman username for “Identity” and type your password.
6. For Server “CA certificate”, select “Do Not Check” or “Don’t Validate” and click “Connect.”
7. The network status will show “Obtaining IP address...” then “Connected.”
